



Target Medicine Mentor Scheme Application Guidance 2023-24

- 1. Target Medicine Mentor Scheme (TMMS) will run primarily in-person at UCL Bloomsbury Campus, with some virtual events. In the event key changes are made to the academic calendar, we will adapt the Mentor Scheme to ensure it runs effectively online, or adopt a blended approach.
- **2.** You can apply to become a Target Medicine Mentor in Years 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5, and a Target Medicine Team Leader in Years 2, 3, 4 or 5.
- **3.** You can choose to be involved in Target Medicine for just one year, or more. We welcome continuity and prioritise returning volunteers.
- **4.** Applying to Target Medicine does not guarantee you a place as this depends on numbers overall. We will, however, accommodate as many volunteers as possible.
- Selection of Team Leaders will be done via shortlist from application forms, followed by interviews on Wednesday 4th October (Year 4 and 5) and Wednesday 11th October (Year 2 and 3).
- 6. Selection of Team Members will be done from application forms alone.
- 7. Your application form will only be seen by the TM Leadership Team which comprises the Target Medicine Manager, Student Lead, Deputy Student Leads, and Academic Lead. Due regard will be given to confidentiality.
- 8. This is an unpaid voluntary role, including attendance at all training and mentoring sessions. However, an hourly rate of pay will be made for working on TM Events, and you will be given priority for other paid UCLMS or Target Medicine opportunities (including Taster Days, UCLMS Open Days and school/college visits).
- 9. Dates of all 2023/24 Mentoring Scheme training, mentor sessions and event dates are provided below.
- **10.** Attendance to mentor sessions and team preparation for sessions is mandatory, so please ensure you can commit to all **mentor session** dates listed below. Team preparation dates and times will be decided within your team.
- **11. Large event** and all volunteers will have the opportunity to apply for these paid roles throughout the year.
